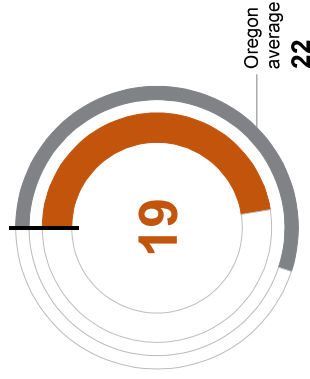

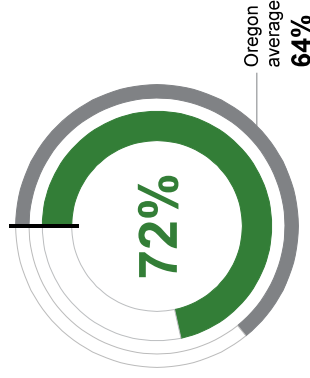

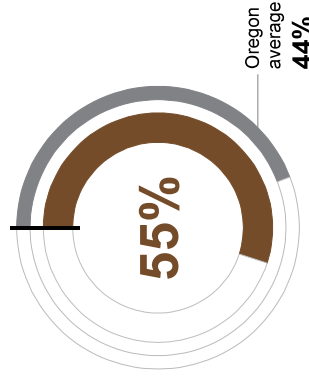
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

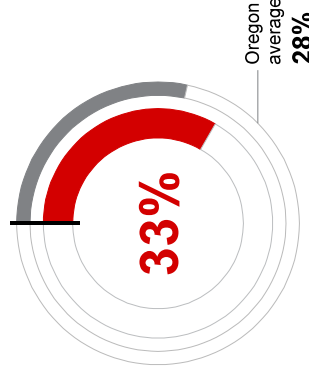
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



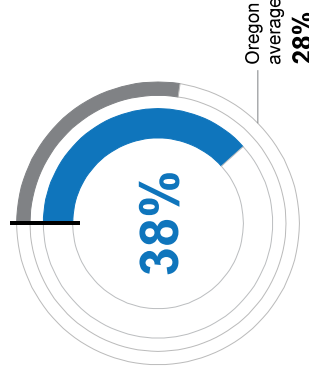
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

We strive to provide a comprehensive education that includes both academic and social emotional components. Providing a stable and engaging learning environment is important as we begin preparing students for the rigors of the real-world. Each year we have a goal to increase attendance and reduce the number of students who are chronically absent. We have incorporated an advisory program to help accomplish our goals. One major focus this year is relationships with the belief that positive relationships with students and families will encourage students to attend school.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, and promote implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Our school welcomes all students. We are proud that our school has provided time for all staff to receive Cultural Agility Training, that our school has an EL Liaison and there has been work on inclusivity and support for all students. We have a full-time social-emotional counselor as well as additional support from outside agencies to provide therapists and a skills trainer. Our district and our school is very knowledgeable about ACES and trauma-informed practices. We believe that staff-student and student-student relationships are integral to student success in school.

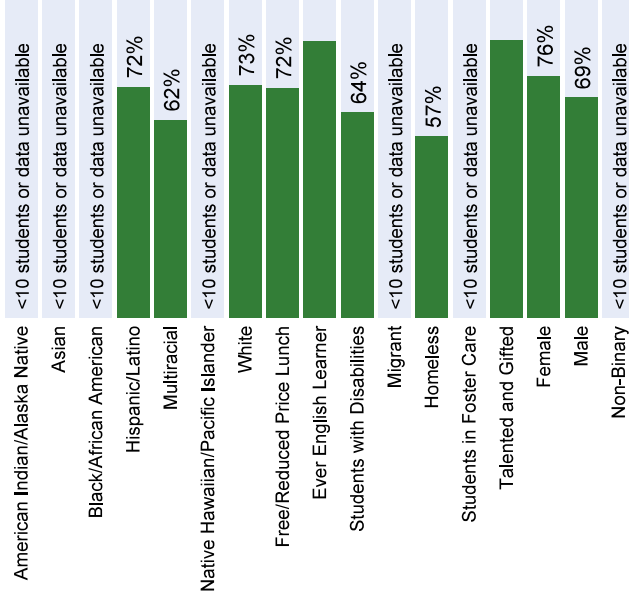

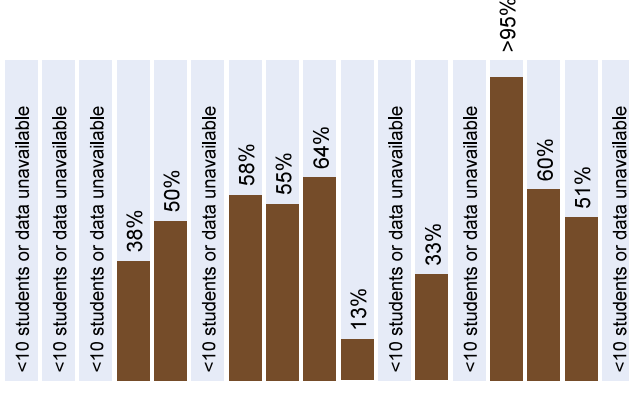
Our Staff (rounded FTE)



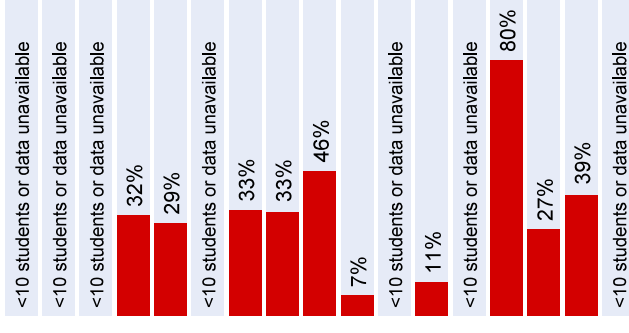

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

We believe a student who feels safe at school is more likely to be successful at school. We have implemented a health curriculum with a focus on strong and healthy relationships. We have also implementing an advisory program with focus areas of organization and social-emotional learning to help with peer-to-peer relationships. We also have a tiered discipline model when situations arise. We do not tolerate bullying, harassment, hazing and hate speech and will deal with it accordingly.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

We believe that extra-curricular activities are a key component in the overall success of a student. We offer a number of athletic programs including cross country, football, volleyball, basketball, wrestling and track. We offer a handful of clubs highlighted by our Robotics club. We have a robust music program including Band, Choir and Orchestra. Approximately 40% of all students in our school are involved in a music program. We are working hard this year to increase the number of clubs available to our students. We are providing an after school activities bus to help encourage more students to participate in the afterschool programs.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parent engagement is necessary and we provide a number of opportunities where this can happen. Our school has representation on the District Parent Advisory Council that helps make suggestions to the district and serves as a sounding board. We have parent representation from each grade level on our school site council which contributes to our School Improvement Plan and guides our Professional Development. We have an active PTSA and allow for parent volunteers.
