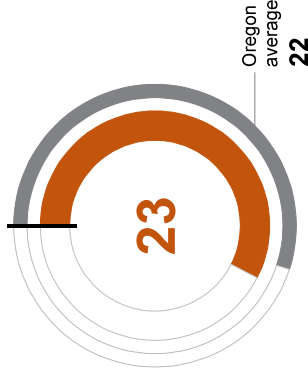

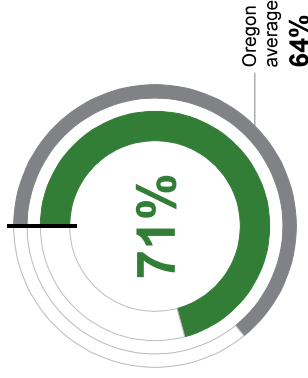

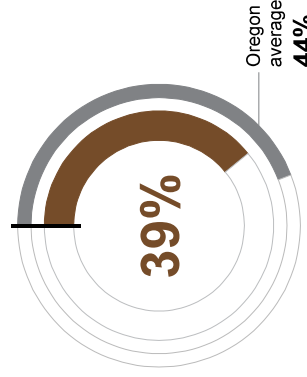

Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

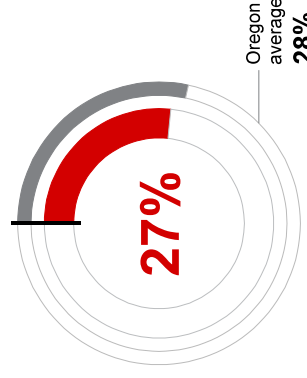
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



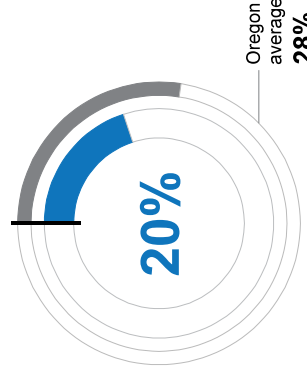
MATHEMATICS

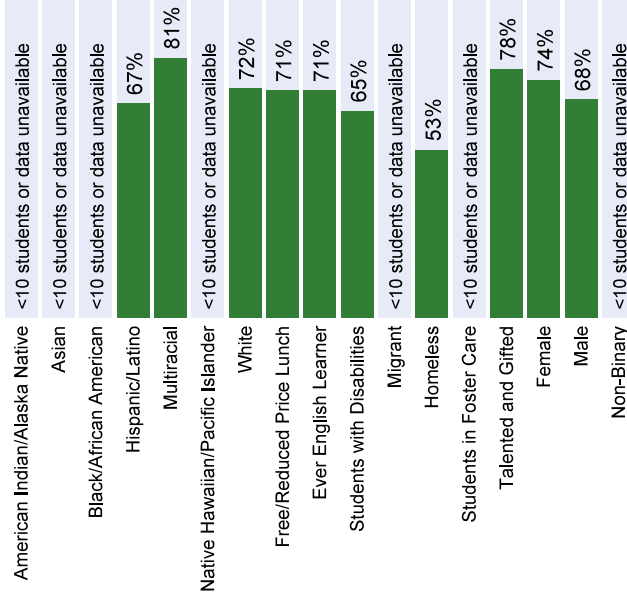

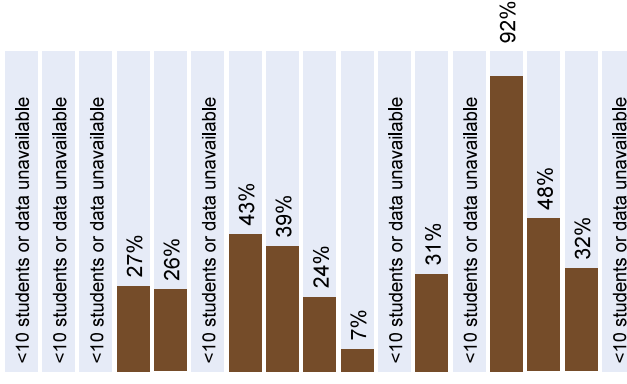

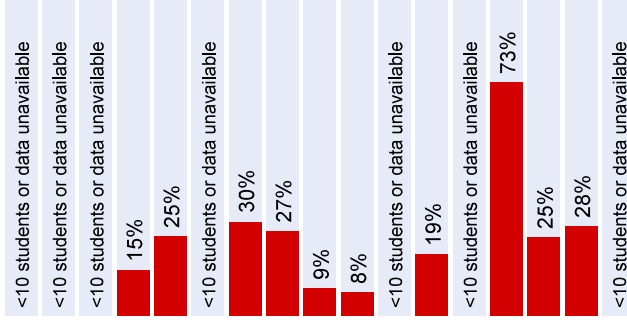

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

To ensure a safe and secure learning environment for all of our students, our school promotes Trojan PRIDE (Perseverance, Respect, Integrity, Diversity, and Excellence) through our schoolwide PBIS system.
