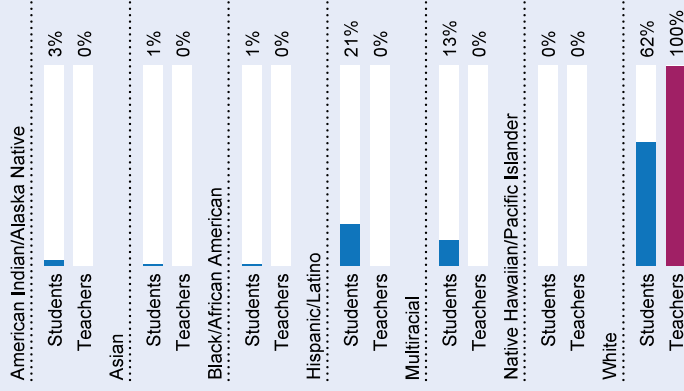

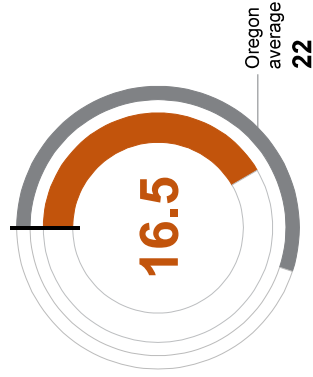

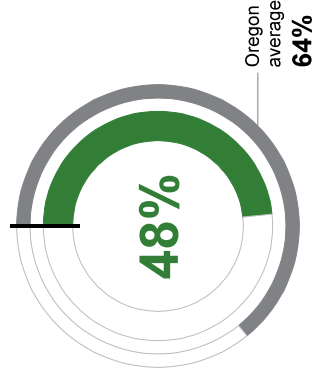
CLASS SIZE

Median size of classes in core subjects.



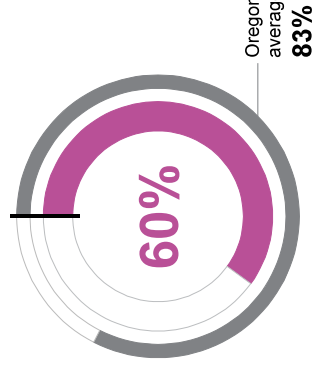
REGULAR ATTENDERS

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

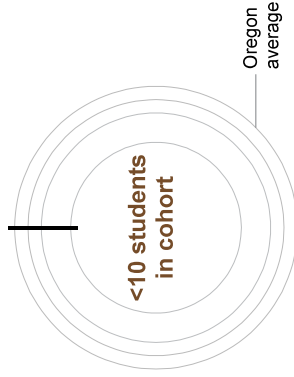
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



Academic Success

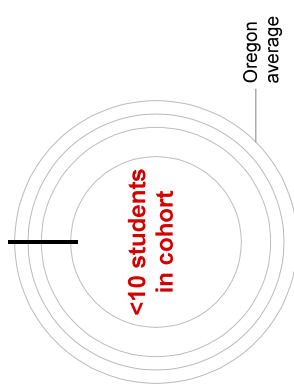
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2017-18 graduating in 2020-21.



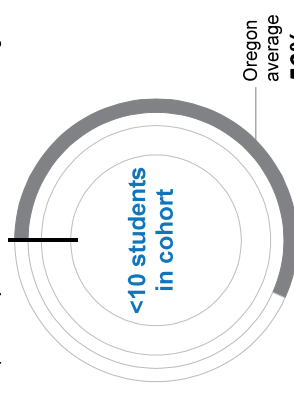
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

This year, GPFLX is focusing on Support, Connection and Excellence. While GPFLX is primarily an online program, we will be providing additional in-person support in our GPFLX classroom space for all students generally but for our Special Education Students in particular. This will help foster a sense of community for the students and the staff. Additionally, we will emphasize the flexible nature of our program with some students being completely online, some students utilizing our classroom space and some of our students taking in-person classes at NMS, SMS or GPHS. We will also seek to maintain our graduation rate (100% in 2021-22).

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

We are making concerted efforts to welcome ALL students and families at GPFLX. Administration has personally met with or reached out to every one of our GPFLX families. These parent meetings are part of the on-boarding process which allows for relationship building as well as developing a Personal Education Plan for each student entering GPFLX. The classroom space will also provide an opportunity to build community & connection. This is in addition to our teachers reaching out to their students to build relationships with them each and every day of the school week.

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

GPFLEX students have the opportunity to take AP classes in Edgenuity (9-12) and all GPFLEX students can take Honors or AP classes on campus at NMS, SMS or GPHS.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

GPFLEX students have the option to attend CTE classes at NMS, SMS or GPHS. There are also CTE options in Edgenuity. The CTE program at GPHS has more program offerings than nearly any other school in the region. The program offers 10 CTE teachers in Basic Early Childhood, Computer Science, Culinary Arts, Health Science, Information Communication Technology, Manufacturing/Engineering Technology, and Marketing/Business Education. All of the GPHS programs have college articulation agreements that allow CTE students to earn college credits. Students have the opportunity to be "program completers" by finishing a pathway within a CTE program. We encourage all of our students to participate in these hands-on classes to develop skills and find their interest and passion.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

GPFLEX students are eligible to participate in sports and clubs at NMS, SMS or GPHS, based on OSAA eligibility requirements. GPHS has 18 approved OSAA sports with over 800 students participating in these activities. Additionally, they have a wide array of clubs for nearly every interest and ability. At present, over 25 clubs are available for students at GPHS.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

"We are GP" is our district wide mantra we believe in. This includes parents, students, community members and staff. We encourage all of our parents to participate in our parent informational nights held on Back to School Night and Parent Conference night. FAFSA night, Junior College night, as well as Booster Club events are open to GPFLEX families at GPHS. Another area Grants Pass School District is focusing on is educating our community on the Resiliency Project. Several informational nights are held at district schools throughout the school year.
