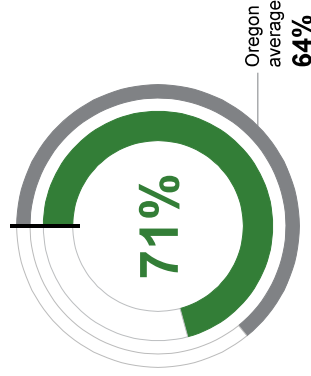

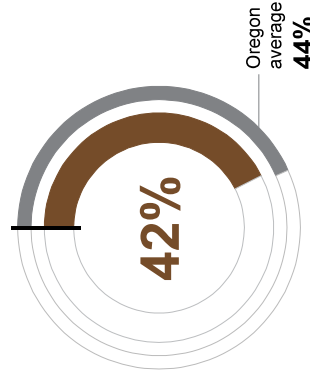
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

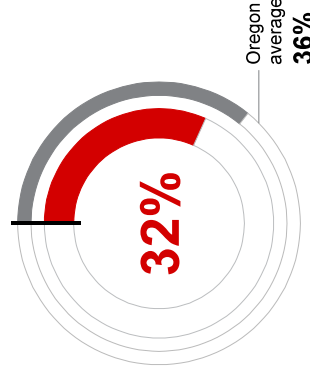
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



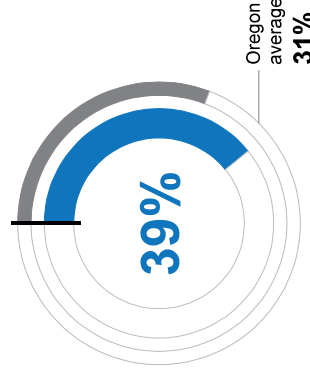
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

This year our staff will continue to put their primary focus in the areas of reading and math. We have a district adopted researched-based math and reading curriculum that is utilized by all of our teachers. Our staff not only provides daily core curriculum instruction, but we also provide students with small group intervention support when it is deemed necessary. Our district utilizes the RTII (Response to Instruction and Intervention) framework to dig deep into student data, assess growth, and determine additional support that our students might need.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, and promote implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Our school partners with our local law enforcement agency to enhance safety with a School Marshall Program. We regularly practice safety routines and trainings so all students feel comfortable and safe. Fire drills are done on a monthly basis. Lockdown and earthquake drills are done bi-annually. We host many events that invite families and community in to our building including Open House, curriculum nights, Fall Festival, and our annual Allen Dale Family BBQ. Musical performances are done at every grade level, and we also host our annual Family Sing-A-Long before the students leave for winter break.

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Each year we review and practice common area rules and expectations including how to use playground equipment safely. We follow school board policies that govern our interventions and responses to bullying and harassment. Our main efforts are in prevention through curriculum and creating an environment that is inclusive and positive. We implement Kelso's Choice and Second Steps Curriculum K-5 year-long as well as the Supplemental Second Steps Bully Prevention Program by the end of October annually. Our new Health Curriculum allows teachers to not only teach students the new health standards, but also focuses on healthy social and emotional skill development for all of our students, grades K-5th.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

In addition to band and strings that is offered to all 4th and 5th graders district-wide, we offer numerous opportunities at Allen Dale outside of the regular school day. Allen Dale prides itself on the number of after school opportunities we are able to offer to our students. These activities include: Honor Choir, Honor Orchestra, Run/Walk Club, Racquet Sports, Art Club, Chess Club, and Archery Club. We believe that keeping students engaged at school as long as possible not only helps develop important social and emotional skills, but also keeps them active and safe beyond the school day.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

We have an active and supportive Parent Teacher Association (PTA) as well as parent representatives on our Site Council and the district Parent Advisory Council. We communicate with families through ParentSquare. This program allows all of our families within Grants Pass School District to utilize one method for communicating with their child's school. Parent conferences are held twice a year and every teacher meets with their student's teachers the first week of school. We welcome family volunteers to work in our classrooms, school wide events and chaperone field trips.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

One of our biggest community partners is OPTIONS of Southern Oregon to provide mental health supports for our students. Our Public Safety Department partners with us to provide training with fire safety, safety protocols and they make classroom visits. We host parent education nights including our very successful READY! for Kindergarten events held three times a year annually. Every grade level attends local field trips partnering with a variety of community organizations and businesses. Grade levels also plan presentations with local community partners to educate students about everything from leading a healthy lifestyle to learning about different careers in our community.
